
Make a Punched-Tin Picture

Maybe you've seen a pierced-tin lantern or candle sconce in the Village (or

in our Museum Gift Shop). Here's a simple way to turn an aluminum pie plate into a holiday wall-hanging using the same kind of tin-punching technique.

First, get an aluminum pie plate--the bigger the better. (Check with someone at home to make sure it's OK to use as a wall hanging; once you punch it full of holes it's no good for making pies!)



With a pencil, draw a picture or a pretty design (a Christmas tree, a snow flake, a holiday candle) on a piece of paper that fits into the bottom of the pie plate.



Tape the piece of paper to the bottom of the plate. Be sure to put the pie plate on a scrap of wood or a piece of heavy cardboard! Then, using a good-sized nail (about 3 inches long) and a hammer, gently punch nail holes about every 1/2 inch or so along the lines until you've traced everything.

Peel off the paper and hang your pie plate on the wall--or in the window--for some sparkly seasonal decorations!
